Safety Instructions:

- The maximum seat height is 640 mm. Ensure that the stool is securely anchored on a stable and level surface before use.
- Make sure that the safety gas spring and its height adjustment function properly to prevent unexpected lowering or falling during use.
- The product should be checked regularly for possible signs of wear, especially the castors and the gas spring.
- Avoid using the stool on uneven or unstable surfaces.
- The double castors have load-dependent brakes. Make sure that they brake reliably under load and are not overloaded.
- Senior citizens and people with reduced mobility should be given support when using the stool.
- Keep the installation and user instructions in order to avoid possible risks during use.
- Using the swivel stool without adequate back support can lead to physical discomfort. Only use the armrest for support, as excessive weight can damage the structure.
- The swivel stool is not suitable for children and should be kept out of their reach.
- If the stool is damaged, stop using it and take steps to repair or replace it.
- Ensure that the stool and its mechanisms, including the brackets and the safety gas spring, are regularly checked for damage to ensure safety.
- Care should be taken to ensure that no parts of the body get caught in the height adjustment mechanism to avoid injury.
- Warning of risk of suffocation due to improper lifting and lowering of the stool and risk of slipping due to insufficient stability on slippery floors.
- During use, ensure that the body weight remains within the specified limits.
- Use on carpet is recommended to prevent the seat from tipping over.
- Keep small parts and tools away from the seat to avoid the risk of falling and injury.
