Safety Instructions:

- Suitable for the storage of water-polluting substances of GHS 1-4. Note: Observe specific safety and handling instructions before use.
- When used for flammable liquids of GHS 1-3: technical ventilation and earthing required, if necessary take additional protective measures outdoors.
- Heavy and solid construction requires special care; only use trained personnel for handling (e.g. with a forklift truck or pallet truck).
- Before use, ensure that the container meets the specific requirements for the stored goods in question.
- When storing hazardous substances, observe the applicable regulations; consult emergency measures and safety data sheets in the event of leaks.
- Only use labelled hazardous substances, wear suitable protective equipment and observe safety regulations.
- Only use the container indoors or outdoors in accordance with the safety instructions and set it up on a firm and level surface.
- Check containers regularly for damage and leaks, install drip pans in accordance with national regulations.
- Keep containers closed when not in use to avoid leaks and contamination.
- Ensure that only authorised persons have access to storage rooms.
- Implementation of the legal requirements for environmental protection and hazard prevention is mandatory, including regular monitoring of storage conditions and corrosion protection measures.
- Carry out a regular visual inspection of the corrosion protection measures every month.
- Ensure insulated construction to prevent heat loss and reduce the risk of fire.
- Use drip pans with a suitable capacity to minimise environmental risks (e.g. 1000 litres).
- Ensure that emergency information is accessible.
