Soft faced hammer SIMPLEX L.330mm head d.40mm medium HO

Safety Instructions:

- The use of protective gloves is recommended to avoid injuries caused by impacts.
- Make sure that the work surface is stable to prevent it from tipping over or slipping.
- Ensure that no persons are in the danger zone while the hammer is being used.
- After use, store the hammer in a safe place to avoid accidents.
- Regularly check the condition of the hammer, especially the handle for cracks or damage.
- Wear safety goggles to avoid eye injuries from falling parts.
- Wear a hard hat to prevent head injuries caused by impact.
- Ensure that the work area is free of obstacles to minimise the risk of falling and injury.
- Only use the tool as intended to avoid injury or damage.
- Check for damage before use and remove from service immediately in the event of defects.
- Suitable personal protective equipment such as safety goggles and gloves must be worn when using the Schonhamer.
- Before use, ensure that the hammer and the inserts are in perfect condition.
- Only hit suitable materials to minimise the risk of injury.
- The hammer may only be used by qualified persons who are familiar with the safety precautions.
- Children should not be allowed to use the hammer to avoid the risk of injury.
- Caution: Choking hazard due to small parts.
- Caution with improper handling: Risk of injury due to improper use.
- Use safety goggles and suitable protective equipment during work.
- The number of blows should be adjusted according to the hard material in order to avoid breakage or deformation of the tool.
- If the clamping housing is damaged, do not use the product and take it out of service immediately.
- Take care when using in elevated positions to avoid falls.
